## **SV Shtandart**

Ramsgate Royal harbour 19<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2014

The frigate 'Shtandart' is a full-size replica of a 'man'o'war' that was the first vessel of the Russian Baltic fleet will be visiting Ramsgate Royal Harbour between 19 - 23 September.

Construction of the original was personally directed by Peter the Great following his protracted visits to, and study at British Royal dockyards. It was launched in 1703. The replica was built in St-Petersburg and launched in 1999.

The new vessel was built from the plans used for the original, and her exterior and interior faithfully recreate one of the most significant eighteenth century ships. Shtandart is a sea-going sail training ship and with her young crew - mostly from Russia, the ship has become a firm favourite at many maritime festivals around Europe.

#### **SAFETY TIPS:**

Here are some tips and hints from our local community police officer to help ensure you have a safe and enjoyable stay:

Use public transport to get around, especially at night. After midnight we recommend using a **taxi** for getting around. **01843 888888** is the phone number for a reliable taxi company called 'Central Cars'.

Please be careful when you are 'out and about' in Margate - the town is no more dangerous than any other in Europe and beyond but it pays to be sensible.

Walk on footpaths facing on-coming traffic. (You can see what's coming & makes it harder for cars to drive up behind you unnoticed.)

Never leave property unattended - property can be stolen. Make sure you don't carry large amounts of money with you. Try and keep cash in different pockets where possible.

Do not display your iphones, stay on well-lit roads and keep together in groups.

If you're in trouble, phone the police AS SOON AS POSSIBLE on **999**. Say this may be an **'Op Columbus'** incident.
